Please use the Holy, Holy, Holy parts with your hymnal. It may be necessary to play from an older hymnal that has the hymn in the original key of Eb. Make copies as needed. This is not under copyright.

Use the Wexford Carol arrangement as desired also. Again, make copies as needed. This is my arrangement (WPF Music) and you have my permission to make these copies. I think you will find this arrangement easy to learn by the average church choir.

For those who are new to using Finale, I would be happy to get you started and/or answer questions that you may have. For those who might be starting arrangements as presented in the webinar, I would be happy to give help and suggestions. For those who would be interested in starting a complete choral or instrumental arrangement, I would again be happy to help and give suggestions along the way. For those looking for existing arrangements, either choral or instrumental hymn arrangements, I have many of these available on the J. W. Pepper web site. The instrumental hymn arrangements are for solo, duet, trio, quartet, quintet, brass choir, string orchestra, church orchestra, and more. They are categorized by Christmas, Easter, Patriotic, etc.

Go to **jwpepper.com**. Enter wpf or Wayne Fritchie in the search box. From the links on the left, choose Woodwinds, Brass, Strings, Choral, Handbells, and more. The music can be previewed and listened to.
